The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is an annual ecumenical celebration. Christians around the world are invited to pray for the unity of all Christians, to reflect on scripture together, to

participate in jointly-organized ecumenical services, and to share fellowship.

The year 2025 marks the 1700th anniversary of the first Ecumenical Council, held in Nicaea, in the year 325. The commemoration of this event in 2025 will provide a unique opportunity to reflect on and celebrate the common faith of Christians, as expressed in the Creed formulated during this Council.

The guiding biblical text fro 2025 WPCU is taken from the Gospel of John 11:17-27. The theme for the 2025 Week of Prayer is, "Do you believe this?" (John 11:26). The theme comes from the dialogue between Jesus and Martha when Jesus visited the home of Martha and Mary in Bethany following the death of their brother Lazarus.

CLAY Gathering 2025


